WHAT'S BEING HARVESTED









Sunchokes or Jerusalem artichokes are easy to grow, delectable perennial tubers that taste best when harvested in late winter. During a recent 50 degree day, Dani removed the dead stalks and dug up the small, bumpy, multi-purpose spuds. Sliced thin and fried in oil, they become irrisistable sweet, crunchy chips. Best of all, although mostly carbs, they don't spike one's glycemic index the way other starches like potatoes do.
