WHAT'S COMING UP IN THE VEGETABLE GARDEN









Everything this year is two or three weeks ahead of normal. The soil is warmer and drier, and frosts have been absent all month which has never happened before in my 20 years experience. As a result, we have been able to plant warm season vegetable seeds much earlier. Above, at mid-month, potatoes and corn are coming up. Below beans break the surface and tomato sets are in! All of these vegetables should be ready to harvest in July!
