Over the winter the contents of the mound will decompose sufficiently to be planted with perennial vegetables next spring.

Sweet, crisp and juicy Asian pears, sweet/tart native beach plums, astringent and nutritious dark purple Aronia (mellowed by cooking), and tasty red raspberries are all ripe and ready to pick in the Edible Forest. Call or email for your U-Pick appointment.

WHAT IS A "COVER CROP"



A cover crop is an intentional planting of a non-food crop to keep something growing rather than leave bare ground. In this instance a combination of millet (grass-likes stalks) and hairy vetch (purple flowering vine) were planted soon after the garlic was harvested this summer. The expectation is that the millet will be "winter-killed," before it sets seed, leaving a straw-like mulch to plant kale plants into next spring.
